Praise be to Allah, who has guided us through the spiritual climate of Ramadan and brought us to this Eid morning. May this Eid be blessed and auspicious for all of us.

Dear Believers! Ka'b bin Ujrah (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated: One day, the Messenger of Allah said to us, "Come closer to the pulpit." We approached, and when he ascended the first step, he said, "Amin!" When he ascended the second step, he again said, "Amin!" And when he ascended the third step, he once more said, "Amin!"

After descending from the pulpit, we asked, "O Messenger of Allah, today we heard something from you that we had never heard before. What is the wisdom behind this?" He replied, "Jibril (Gabriel) appeared to me and said, 'May the one who reaches Ramadan and is not forgiven be humiliated and disgraced!' I said, 'Amin!' When I ascended the second step, he said, 'May the one who hears your name mentioned and does not send blessings upon you be humiliated and disgraced!' I said, 'Amin!' When I ascended the third step, he said, 'May the one whose parents or one of them reaches old age in their presence and does not please them, thereby

failing to earn Paradise, be humiliated and disgraced!' I said, 'Amin!''' (Tirmidhi, 100/3545)

May Allah save us from being among the humiliated and disgraced. May He make us among those who receive their salvation on this Eid morning. As our Prophet said, Allah has gifted us Muslims two Eids: Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha.

Respected Ones! Eid is about brotherhood, forgiveness, unity, and harmony. It is about bringing hearts together. On this blessed day, let us set aside grudges. The Prophet said, "Do not harbor hatred, envy, or turn away from one another. O servants of Allah, be brothers!" (Bukhari, Adab, 57) Eid is about loving for the sake of Allah and disliking for the sake of Allah. It is about bringing joy to broken hearts and sorrowful souls. Let us honor the days of Eid by dressing cleanly and beautifully, applying pleasant fragrances, and celebrating with enthusiasm in a manner befitting our religion and culture. Let us care for the poor and the lonely as much as we can, bring joy to orphans, seek the blessings of our elders by kissing their hands, and make our children happy. If we have not yet done so, let us give our fitr and zakat. May Allah grant us the opportunity to reach many more Eids in health and well-being. May your Eid be blessed!

I conclude our khutbah with the supplication of the Prophet : "O Allah, guide us to the straight path, unite our hearts, reconcile our differences, lead us to the paths of peace, and bless us with Your bounties." (Abu Dawud, Salat, 358)
